

PUBLIC TO PAY RIOTERS' FINES

SUBSCRIPTION PAPER CIRCULATED ABOUT CITY—OMO EMPLOYEES GIVE FRANK GORMAN \$88.

That a considerable proportion of the population of the city is in sympathy with the rioters who were fined yesterday in the city court for participating in demonstration against Carl Herrmann and his son, is evidenced by the fact that a movement is on foot to raise money to pay the fines and legal expenses of the three young men. The fines, costs of the court and counsel fees, amount to about \$44 in each case. Subscriptions to the fund are being taken at Bride's store, Convey Cigar store, and J. F. Connery's bicycle store. All funds in excess of the young men's expenses will be turned over to the Red Cross.

That was the support of the employees of the Omo Mfg. Co. of their fellow worker, Frank Gorman, one of the young men found guilty, is of a financial as well as a moral nature was indicated this morning when a subscription list was circulated at that factory for his benefit. In a short time \$88 was raised. This amount was presented to Mr. Gorman with the best wishes and hearty sympathy of the employees. The amount over his fine, etc., is a gift to him as a concrete testimonial of their endorsement of his action.

It was reported this afternoon that the general subscription paper is meeting with generous contributions, people from Portland even coming to the front to swell the fund. The case is still the talk of the town, and promises to outlive the customary nine days' period.
