The Hartford Rubber Works as a part of the United States Rubber Works must turn out its share of the product. July 18 or 20 is the date set for the beginning of the work. President Whitelesey said yester-

day that he was desirous of obtaining the services of about 150 school teachers or even more. The pay and working hours are to be attractively arranged, he said, and the working hours from 8:30 to 11:30 o'clock in the morning, from 2 to 5 o'clock in the morning, from 2 to 5 o'clock in the afternoon and from 6 to 9 o'clock at high. The night hours are for clerks who are employed at other work in the daytime. Forty days will be devoted to the production of the orders.
