Dear Mr. Gilroy:

May I bring to your attention the move to establish a Pro-Nazi camp in the Town of Southbury, Conn., of which this parish is a part. Announcement was made on Monday Nov., 15 through the Waterbury Republican of the purchase of 175 acres secured in the name of one Wolfgang Jung of Stamford for the organization known as the German-American Bund. The plan as announced is to establish in New England the largest camp of this nature. As you likely know, other camps have been built in New Jersey and on Long Island.

There is much resentment within the Township over this proposal. I shall deal with the matter at the discourse period on Sunday next. The above newspaper is hartily opposed. Many organizations have signified their opposition. I have written several officials to direct their attention to the matter, and will inclose copies. These copies I have also sent to the Christian Century. You are free to use them if you desire. Or if you think best, you may pass them along to the Council for Social Action.

In any case, I want to do what I can to register the opposition of the Church to this alien and Un-Christian movement.
